#### Swim Club News

At the annual meeting, which was held at the Council on Friday, January 18, 2013, Joe Marateo was elected as the Swim Club President. Also, Bylaw changes were read on the floor, voted on and approved by a show of hands. Most notable of the bylaw changes is that there is no longer any family membership provision being made for children over 25 years of age living at home, they must either join the Knights of Columbus or the Columbiettes in order to be a badged Swim Club Member.

The Swim Club is currently accepting applications for Lifeguards to supplement our current workforce. If you have been a lifeguard at another facility, or if you are a new lifeguard or if you want to become a lifeguard, you must contact a Swim Club Board member and request an interview as soon as possible. You can also leave your contact information at the Union Council #4504 or the Columbian Club bar. We will advise potential new guards on the certification process and we can recommend certification facilities.

I want to thank the brother Knights that served us well and find it regrettable that this action was necessary. I was only replacing the President, the Bar Manager and the Kitchen Manager. No other members were asked to resign but several members walked out. These individuals were given 48 hours to contact me if they wish to retain their positions otherwise their actions will be considered resignations.

I have an initial team in place to fill the vacant slots necessary to keep things running as smoothly as possible. I also welcome all Brothers (in good standing) who wish to help rebuild and reorganize to contact me.

I have asked the outgoing officers to remain Catholic Gentlemen and to be honorable and available this transition period. For those few who might not think this way, summary suspensions have already been discussed with our District Deputy, our State Warden and our State Deputy.

This reorganization is not a statement about the members as Knights. Several have been dedicated, contributing members who offered years of service and for that I thank them. This reorganization is about getting us back on track as Knights and as a Knight of Columbus Council.
