Fund Raising with TD Bank

Union Council 4504 has joined TD Bank's Affinity program. The Affinity program is a great opportunity for all of us at Union Council to raise money for our charitable fund simply by linking accounts at TD Bank to Union Council. TD Bank will contribute \$10 to our council for every existing checking account which is linked to 4504 and \$50 for each new account linked to 4504. Any Brother Knight who has made his 3rd degree should consider taking the 4h degree at the upcoming exemplification on **March 30, 2014**. This degree is the final degree of the Order, and is focused on the principle of Patriotism. At the end of the ceremony, the attendees attain the title Sir Knight, and are then able to participate in the Color Corp of the Knights of Columbus, the visible arm of the Order.

Why should anyone consider taking this final degree? For many, the answer varies, but for those who value the principles of the Knights, the taking of this degree allows you to learn more about the important principle of Patriotism. In addition, new Sir Knights gain a better understanding of what it means to be a Catholic in today's United States, and how we all play a key role in defending and supporting the principles of our great country.

The exemplification is a very formal affair, requiring that all candidates rent or buy a tuxedo for the day. After the ceremony, the new Sir Knights and their spouses are then invited to a festive formal dinner. As in year's past, the March exemplification will be held at the Parsippany Hilton on Route 10.

Membership in the Fourth degree does involve the payment of nominal annual dues that are used to support the needs of the Assembly. Meetings of the Assembly take place in our Council home on the 4th Wednesday of every month.
