After World War II the name of the holiday was changed to Veteran's Day in the United States to honor all Veterans of our Armed Forces. And so in the Spirit of Veteran's Day we are naming our Brother Knights at Union Council 4504 who are presently serving actively in our Armed Forces.

Airman First Class Ryan O'Grady - US Air Force



On Saturday October 13, 2012 a group of from Union Knights of Columbus visited the National 9/11 Memorial in New York, NY.
