### MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT





Brothers, Families and Friends:

This year's calendar not only has an extra day in February due to leap year, but the phases of the moon have also resulted in Easter Sunday falling on March 23, about as early as it possibly can be. 
## St Patrick's Day Parade
