

He spent four years as a missionary in Bolivia where he met and married his wife Liliana. In 2007 he began work as a Program Development Specialist with Union County's Department of Human Services helping the homeless disabled. He was

a member of the Board of Trustees of Hudson Hospice, Inc. for 15 years.

Ray has a Bachelor's degree from Seton Hall University in Languages and Philosophy. He also has the equivalent of a Master's degree in Theology. He is a United States Marine Corps veteran with a Navy Commendation citation. He is also a Notary Public. He worked as a Patient Representative at a Level II Trauma Center where he won numerous awards for Five- Star customer service. Ray also became a Fellow in the Society for Healthcare Consumer Advocacy of the American Hospital Association.

Besides all this, Ray serves at Saint Adalbert's Church in Elizabeth as a lector and religious education teacher for the students preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation and RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Ray has three children, Monica, Daniel, and Eric, a policeman in the City of Elizabeth, who was recently promoted to Sergeant. He also does photography and has had photographs published in six books. Ray, along with his father, has been a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 4504 since 1976. He is a Fourth Degree Knight and commander of the Color Corps. He tries to attend the wakes of fellow Knights, participates in the fund raising efforts for citizens with intellectual disabilities, and distributes food to union county residents.

In February 2020 he went on a trip to the holy land and was invited to do a reading. While there he also renewed his wedding vows on the same trip. We as Council 4504, are proud to honor brother Ray Gora as the Knight of the Month for February 2021.

Intellectual Disabilities

Ladies and Gentlemen the collections for our Intellectual Disabilities has not been going well. With this covid virus it has been difficult to collect at Churches or Stores and also our largest collection being on the Streets. These funds go to up Charities with those that have Disabilities with their facilities. Normally the State has collected close to \$500,000 to \$600,000. To date 19 Councils have submitted for the Columbian year of 2019-2020 was only \$50,000.

Over the years we have made some fairly nice distribution of funds to four Charitable Organizations. At the moment we would be fortunate to help one Organization. We had contributed \$2,800 last year that the four Organizations received a \$700 donation.
