#### MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT



I have had to deal with the loss of people I know these past few weeks and wonder if the same situation that I had to deal with in 2015 was repeating itself. However, we have to have faith in God and believe that he will take care of things for us. I recently lost a cousin in a motorcycle accident. A week later, I attended the memorial service for the daughter of a family friend from Dominica and now have to deal with the loss of one of our brothers, Jeff Alino. Jeff was a very close friend of DGK Mike Willemse and was one of the pilots killed in the crash at Teterboro just a few days ago.

Every day, we are reminded that those that we love will someday leave us. But what usually compounds it is the way that those dear ones leave us, unexpectedly. We do not get the opportunities to say "See You," or "Later." We see our loved ones lying in the casket and we are heartbroken. We ask ourselves questions trying to give some meaning to why they had to leave us so soon.

Jeff was a relatively new member at 4504 but he touched the hearts of many in that space of time. He had just completed his first degree and we were hoping that he would be part of the 2nd degree exemplification but he did not live to see it.

We have lost many brothers at 4504 but I am not sure if anyone has had to see the way that Jeff left us. For those of us who saw the videos it will continue to haunt us for a long time.

None of us knows the hour when we shall be called to stand before the throne, and that is why, as brother knights, we must strive to leave a just life; a happy life and one filled with brotherly love. The friendships and relations that we build throughout our years as "knights," should not be taken lightly. We should always be thankful that we have an opportunity to share our blessings with others. That we can help other brothers who need the help of someone just to listen to them or just like we did this past weekend in Wildwood, to share our friendship; to participate in activities that help strengthen the bond that keeps us alive, well and kicking.

Some of our brothers may depart soon, but we have to cherish the memories. As I love to say, "Memories are Forever." The memories of a brother's good deed; the memories of a brother listening to another troubled brother and helping him through the storm; the memories of all the sacrifices that we all have made through the years to maintain the image of the Knights and to live by the motto. Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism and the memories of those who have touched our lives in one way or the other either through a good deed; their concern for our well-being; for their smile and confidence, like Jeff and my cousin, Sheldon, the one who died in a horrific motorcycle accident earlier this month.

Yes, we may cry. We may feel cheated. We may feel empty. We may even get angry. However, we have no control over life and death and all we, as catholic gentlemen; as members of one of the greatest groups of men throughout the world, can do, is to "have each other's back."

It is with deep regret that we announce the passing of one of our newest members, Jeffrey Alino. A Union resident his whole life, Jeff was born on January 23rd, 1984, and graduated from Union High School in 2002. Jeff's dream was to take to the skies and be a commercial pilot. He decided to pursue his dream job and studied Aviation Studies. He successfully earned his private pilot license and instrument rating by 2010, and received his multiengine commercial and ATP pilot license by 2012. He flew for multiple companies including Delta, Hawaiian and Trans-Pacific Jet.

Jeff joined our council three months ago. Although he was a member for a short time, he always came to the council with a smile and shared his amazing stories and experiences as a pilot. Unfortunately, Jeff was the co-pilot who lost his life in the recent Teterboro Airport crash on Monday, 15th May.

Jeff was a true family man who loved his mother and his two sisters. He often spoke of how he wanted to buy his mother a retirement home in Texas. Jeff was also a community man helping elderly neighbors maintaining their lawns and cleaning their houses whenever he had time off. His family and friends will miss him dearly.

#### Our Lady of Fatima, May 13, 1917



Last month we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Fatima with special solemnity, as we marked the 100th anniversary of her first apparition to three shepherd children in a small town in Portugal.

Over the course of Mary's six monthly apparitions in 1917, she instructed Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco to pray the Rosary daily for peace, and to make sacrifices for sinners, saying that "many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and pray for them." They took her advice seriously, finding many ways to offer sacrifices out of love for Our Lord and for all of His people. Today, during his visit to Fatima, Pope Francis will recognize their heroic virtue by canonizing Jacinta and Francisco. (Their cousin Lucia's cause for beatification was recently opened.)

We ourselves may not be able to travel to Fatima during this momentous year, but we can listen to Our Lady's requests. Saint John Paul II tells us that "the message of Fatima is, in its basic nucleus, a call to conversion and repentance as in the Gospel." This call is an expression of Mary's deep love for all of us, her children. As our mother, she desires that all of us should draw close to her Son, and she asks us to pray her own prayer, the Rosary, to obtain this grace. Only in this way will we be able to obtain the peace so needed by our world.

Let us imitate Jacinta, Francisco, and Lucia, the three shepherd children of Fatima, and accept all of our own sufferings out of love. We pray for all sinners, including ourselves, as we say the prayer Our Lady of Fatima asked to be added after each mystery of the Rosary: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fire of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need of Thy mercy." - Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist.
